'Pulling Together'

Rachel and I arrived in the Eden Valley in October 2019. Wherever we had been in the UK in March 2020 would have been life-changing. Being here has opened my eyes in so many ways. Appreciating the focus of livestock farmers where life has gone on as normal with the intensity of weeks of lambing and calving. Noticing the same volunteer at the Appleby supermarket opening and closing the door, when I visited. The adaptability of local shops to arrange home deliveries in collaboration. The resourcefulness of people baking bread for new markets. People coming into the streets in Long Marton to honk, rattle, clap, ring and bang on Thursdays at 8pm. The diligence of local schools which have made a transition to online learning and support, and are about to reconvene again in June – at least to make a start. Listening to people who have faced the disappointment of missed events and gatherings, yet without any anger. Aware of the daily efforts of people working in home care, increasingly with more PPE and focus, as ever, on safe practice. Postmen and women carrying on, as normal. People unable to work, people who have lost their jobs either temporarily or permanently. Deeply moved to see and hear of people lining village greens (safely socially distanced) in Dufton, Hilton, Kirkby Thore and Warcop, for example, to show respects as the hearse passes on the way to graveside funerals in churchyards and cemeteries. The quiet dignity, professionalism and compassion of our local funeral directors. The buzz of social enterprises exploring how to meet needs; the Upper Eden Foodbank meeting daily needs. The local village WhatsApp groups and neighbourly schemes making sure that those most vulnerable get some attention. The NHS staff, the medical practices, quietly going about their daily routines and shifts; showing community, local and national leadership. How right that the new, temporary, hospital units have born the name Nightingale, recalling a great nursing leader from the nineteenth century. And even our local churches which have adapted to the new realities with YouTube services online, and Zoom meetings like everyone else. Social media opening up fresh ways to communicate and support one another during lock down. For ourselves, it has also been a time for regular walks and to stop and think more deeply, and I've respected those older people, those who are retired, who have taken a more private and measured approach to it all. Many individual families and people have been hugely disciplined, for the sake of others. This can only be a partial view of how our communities have pulled together while apart, but I hope we can all continue to say thankyou and appreciate how special it is when in the face of real suffering and loss we have come through this, endured so well. My belief and mission is that we will find new and creative ways forward in the Eden Valley during the rest of 2020 and beyond. Clive Hicks



# Even if you have no smart phone, no broadband, there is a FREE Online Phone Line

The Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, launched a free national phone line on 26 April 2020 as a simple new way to bring worship and prayer into people's homes while church buildings are closed because of the coronavirus. Daily Hope offers music, prayers and reflections as well as full worship services from the Church of England at the end of a telephone line.

The line – which is available 24 hours a day on **0800 804 8044** – has been set up particularly with those unable to join online church services during the period of restrictions in mind.

The service is supported by the Church of England nationally as well as through the Connections group based at Holy Trinity Claygate in Surrey and the Christian charity Faith in Later Life.

Although thousands of churches across the country are now running services and prayer groups online while public worship remains suspended, many people – especially older people – do not have access to the internet. The line also recognises the impact of social distancing restrictions and self-isolation measures on those suffering from loneliness.

Callers will hear a special greeting from the Archbishop before being able to choose from a range of options, including hymns, prayers, reflections and advice on COVID-19.

A section called Hymn Line offers callers a small selection of hymns, updated daily. An option entitled 'Hymns We Love', provides a hymn and reflection and is based on an initiative by the Connections group.

Archbishop Justin said: "With many in our country on lockdown, it's important that we support those who are feeling lonely and isolated, whatever age they are. The Daily Hope service will allow people to hear hymns, prayers and words that offer comfort and hope."

#### From the Rector

The diary section for our church services now looks very different.Indeed the way the churches operate has changed dramatically since March when it became clear that church buildings had to be closed to reduce risks to the general public and church attendees. Church services are being provided online through YouTube, Facebook and in some cases Zoom and other online technology. The Church of England also just launched a FREE telephone service, as well, which those without internet access might like to try out.

We are so sorry that weddings and baptisms have had to be postponed, but we will be staying in touch with couples and families in order to provide alternative arrangements later in 2020 or in 2021.

We continue to offer practical support and counsel alongside community groups across the Heart of Eden communities, and our clergy are taking funerals at the graveside in churchyards and cemeteries, as well as at the crematoria. We are thankful that families are being so patient under these circumstances. We are so grateful for all the hard work our local funeral directors Glyn Jones, and Walkers, and others in Penrith and Carlisle, do through this challenging time.

We hope to make a lot more use of the church pages on A Church Near You during this period of enforced closure, so please check there for details on arrangements for baptisms, weddings and funerals going forward.



# The Commonwealth War Grave in

The outside observer will not see a War Memorial in

Asby, although those in the know are aware that at some time in the past the "village" War Memorial was built into



an inner wall of the village school - where it can still be seen. But it only commemorates World War One. The Commonwealth War Grave in St Peter's churchyard is that of the only village death on active service in World War Two - a Bomber Command gunner who died on 1 October 1943 aged just 22. He was a member of the crew of a Halifax aircraft which, while on a training mission over the UK, broke up after failing to recover from a violent spin. Because the accident occurred over the UK, his remains were returned to his parents (then living in Great Asby), and were buried in the parish churchyard on 5 October. The headstone was erected later, of course, but was chosen by his parents, and is not of the standard CWGC design. So William rests by Asby Beck, less than a hundred yards from what was his parental home.

Footnote: what we don't know is why William is also commemorated on the village War Memorials in both Warcop and Murton: does anyone? Thanks to John Bevan for this contribution. Ed.

# **Appleby Town Council**

#### Lockdown

At the time of writing there are hopes that the lockdown rules imposed because of the health crisis may be relaxed in the next few weeks. The local community has generally shown stoic calm and good temper in circumstances that could not have been foreseen. The Council extends commiserations to families directly affected by the virus and grateful thanks to all – carers, key workers, retailers, volunteers – who have kept life going.

#### Mayor-Making

The sole nominee for the position of mayor for the year 2020-21 is Councillor Gareth Hayes; Appleby councillors have chosen Councillor Jim Chalmers as his deputy. They are already serving the community, but because of social distancing rules it is not yet possible to set a date for their formal installation.

#### **High and Low Crosses**

Work to restore these two famous Appleby landmarks was halted because of lockdown. It is now expected that it will be completed in summer, with the scaffolding removed and the historic glory of the crosses there for all to see.

#### Public Hal

Jointly paid by for by Eden's community fund, Appleby's building fund and the Norben Charity, work has been carried out during lockdown to repair a plumbing problem and refurbish the two kitchens in the Public Hall. When there will again be public access to community events it is not yet possible to say.

#### **Moot Hall**

Because of lockdown the Moot Hall has been closed to the public. It is hoped that when it does re-open its appearance will have been improved by the restoration and replanting of the window boxes.

#### **A66**

Highways England have now issued their 'A 66 Northern Trans-Pennine Preferred Route Announcement'. The implementation of the project will take

several years. In the meantime essential work has to be done on both the Temple Sowerby and Appleby by-passes, entailing partial closures during summer 2020.

#### **Public Transport**

As detailed in 'Bus News', we still have a daily buses between Appleby and Penrith; there are also regular trains to Carlisle and Leeds and Appleby station is manned. These services are available to all who need them, passengers will not be interrogated. Because loadings are low at present, social distancing is very easy. Bus fares should be paid for by card or with the exact amount. Rail tickets should be purchased before the train is boarded.

#### **Public Conveniences**

All public conveniences have been closed since lockdown. Before they can be reopened there must be thorough cleaning, flushing of systems, testing for legionella and risk assessments, which is likely to take some weeks.

# A66 Progress report

Following a busy consultation in summer 2019, we have now announced the preferred route for dualling the remaining single carriageway sections of the A66 between Penrith and Scotch Corner.

The A66 is both a nationally important road, linking the M6 at Penrith in Cumbria with the A1(M) at Scotch Corner in North Yorkshire, and a key regional route. As well as benefiting local people the upgrade will support tourism and freight traffic, improving connections between ports in Scotland and Northern Ireland and those in England at Hull and Felixstowe.

The proposed route includes five new bypasses and an underpass at the congested Kemplay Bank roundabout near Penrith. The proposals also include significant improvements to the existing junctions between Barnard Castle and the A66 at Bowes and Rokeby. These will improve safety at the two junctions and make for safer, smoother journeys for HGVs. The options we have selected were the most popular among the hundreds of people who responded to last year's public consultation.

All of the villages being bypassed will benefit from the removal of high volumes of traffic, including HGVs, from the existing road as well as improved community connectivity. Pedestrians, cyclists, and horse riders will also benefit from the upgrade which will reduce collisions, competition from other vehicles and associated congestion along one of the most important commercial routes in the north of the United Kingdom.

# What's next?

Now we have announced the preferred route, we will carry out further surveys and investigations to help us design the scheme in more detail. Once Government restrictions on social distancing are lifted, you may start to notice some activity in the area as begin these surveys.

We plan to consult on the design of the road and the junctions in 2021, giving you a further opportunity to share your views with us. Throughout the process we will keep listening and talking to everyone with an interest in the project. There will also be regular updates and information on this webpage.

Development Consent Order process (DCO)

The A66 Northern Trans-Pennine project is known as a Nationally Significant Project (NSIP). This means that we must apply for a Development Consent Order (DCO) to proceed with the project.

# Could you do something amazing?

Cumbria County Council supports the wonderful work done by over 200 foster families, some in the Appleby area. Fosterers are part of a team, with their own social worker and contact with other carers. With over 600 children needing foster families, more volunteers are always needed There are a number of different schemes:

Short Term Fostering: children are looked after until family circumstances change to enable them to return home.

Long Term Fostering: children need a substitute permanent family.

Approved Support (Respite) Care: children are looked after for short periods, usually weekends or holidays to provide temporary breaks for their carers/families.

Short Breaks (Shared Care): carers are linked with families who have one or more children with disabilities, to provide regular short-term care.

Homestays. Families with room to spare supply supported accommodation for young people in work, training or employment who are leaving the care system and learning to

## **Volunteers Needed to Support Families with** Young Children

Cumbria Family Support (Note new name - as they used to be East Cumbria Family Support) need more volunteers to support families who are going through a difficult patch, and have young or primary age children.

Volunteers are carefully 'matched' with a family and then visit weekly to provide practical/emotional support to parent/s, and/or children as needed. Support might involve looking after a child to enable a parent to attend appointments which benefit the whole family; or focus on building positive relationships by facilitating family activities. Sometimes support may focus on helping parents to build on their strengths, and feel confident about the

decisions they make. These are just examples, and each family's needs are individually assessed. To use that well- worn phrase - 'we do what it says on the tin'- we support families.

Our volunteers come from all walks of life, and are of all ages and experience. They respect family confidentiality, are non-judgemental and have been at the heart of our organisation since we began 24 years ago.





# **Zoom Meetings - Best Practice**


As more and more people use video conferencing and webinar technology, a quick reminder on some best practices to maintain security:

- 6. Use the waiting room function to monitor those wishing to enter
- 7. Remove participants where necessary





#### St Matthew

Matthew was one of 12 apostles. But he began as a publican i.e. a tax-collector of Jewish race who worked for the Romans, before he left all at the call of Christ. From earliest times, he was regarded as the author of the first of the four Gospels. The Gospel of Matthew is in correct, concise style, very suitable for public reading.

His usual emblem as an evangelist is a man, because his genealogy emphasised the family ties of Christ. In art, he has been represented as either an evangelist or as an apostle. As an evangelist, he has been depicted sitting at a desk, writing his gospel with an angel holding the inkwell. In the Middle Ages he was even given a pair of spectacles. Matthew was martyred by a sword or a spear, some think in Ethiopia.

# Terry Waite - on coping with lockdown

Terry Waite spent four years in solitary confinement in Beirut. He says: "In isolation, it is easy to become introspective and depressed. All of us, when we are honest and examine ourselves critically, will discover things about ourselves of which we are not especially proud. I had to learn how to grow a greater acceptance of myself and work towards a deeper inner harmony.

".... Today in lockdown, it's important to keep yourself well. Don't slob around all day in pyjamas and a dressing gown. Dress properly and develop a routine. It's important to have a structure – get up at a certain time, eat regular meals and so on.

"If you have faith, then that will give you resources to draw on", especially if you know some hymns, psalms and prayers by heart. "When I was captured, they were there to call on."

#### Run run run!

Do you think of yourself as a runner? If not, now may be the time to consider taking it up.

According to the NHS, running burns more calories than any other mainstream sport, which is perfect if you want to shed a few pounds.

Running is a cardio exercise, which means it gets your heart rate up and your blood pumping. That not only improves your general fitness, but it is also great for protecting you from heart disease, type 2 diabetes and stroke.

Running also improves your sense of well-being because it releases natural endorphins, which are your mood-boosting hormones. And if you want maximum benefit, try running in green spaces – being out in nature has a measurable positive impact on your psychological health.

Don't be afraid to start slow. Remember that ANY fitness activity which raises your heart rate and gets you a bit out of breath is good for you. One excellent way to begin is to try alternating a few steps of running with a few steps of walking. That will help build your fitness levels in record time!

During this period of staying so much at home, how much exercise is good?


According to immunologists, regular bouts of moderate-intensity exercise can help build our resistance to infection. "Regular moderate exercise ensures that our lymph, which is the circulatory system of our immune cells, keeps flowing," says Dr Jenna Macciochi, of the University of Sussex.

Regular moderate exercise can also improve our sleep, help control weight, and prevent muscle loss. Some experts suggest that mild to moderate is for 20 – 45 minutes up to three times a week. However, avoid exerting to exhaustion, which decreases your immunity.


